

Based on Article 98 of the Law on Higher Education ("Official Gazette of the Republic of Serbia", No. 88/2017, 73/2018, 27/2018 - other laws, 67/2019, 6/2020 - other laws, 67/2021, 76/2023 and 19/2025), Article 85 of the Statute of the University of Belgrade ("Official Gazette of the University of Belgrade", No. 201/2018, 207/2019, 213/2020, 214/2020, 217/2020, 230/2021, 232/2022, 233/2022, 236/2022, 241/2022, 243/2022, 244/2023, 245/2023, 247/23, 251/23, 258/24, 260/25 and 262/25), the Regulation on the Enrollment of Students in Study Programs of the University of Belgrade ("Gazette of the University of Belgrade", No. 208/2019, 212/2019, 241/2022 and 252/24), the Regulation on the Method of Determining the Status of Candidates and Students with Disabilities ("Gazette of the University of Belgrade", No. 234/2022 and 238/2022) and the Decision of the Senate of the University of Belgrade on the Announcement of the Call for Student Enrollment of April 15, 2026, the University of Belgrade is announcing a unified

THE CALL

FOR ENROLLMENT OF STUDENTS IN THE SPECIALIST ACADEMIC STUDIES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF BELGRADE IN THE ACADEMIC YEAR OF 2026/2027

In the academic year of 2026/2027, the University of Belgrade enrolls students in the first year of study programmes of the specialist academic studies whose holders are Faculties within the University of Belgrade.

STUDY PROGRAMME

The study programmes of specialist academic studies contain compulsory and elective courses in the total scope of at least 60 ECTS credits.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS OF THE CALL

Candidates who have completed undergraduate academic studies and master academic studies or integrated academic studies, in the scope of at least 300 ECTS credits, may enroll in study programs of specialist academic studies;

Special conditions for enrollment in study programs are an integral part of the respective study programs.

Persons who have completed their previous level of studies no later than October 14, 2026 may apply for the call.

In exercising the right to enroll in a study program, candidates have equal rights that cannot be restricted on the basis of gender, race, marital status, skin color, language, religion, political opinion, national, social or ethnic origin, disability or other similar grounds, position or circumstances.

CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING THE ORDER OF CANDIDATES

The order of candidates for enrollment in the first year of specialist academic studies is determined based on the overall average grade achieved in undergraduate and master academic studies, i.e. integrated studies, the length of study in previous studies and the results of the entrance exam, i.e. the exam to test aptitude and abilities, if such exams are organized, and according to the criteria established by the general act of the faculty, i.e. the University.

The overall average grade of study (OAG) is calculated on the basis of the average grades of study in undergraduate studies (GrUS) and master academic studies (GrMS), weighted by the duration of the study programme in undergraduate and master academic studies expressed in ECTS (UScredit and MScredit):

$$\text{Overall Average Grade (OAG)} = \frac{\text{GrUS} \times \text{UScredit} + \text{GrMS} \times \text{MScredit}}{\text{UScredit} + \text{MScredit}}$$

For candidates who have completed integrated studies, the average grade achieved in those studies, the length of study, the achieved scientific results and other conditions prescribed by the general act of the Faculty are taken.

For candidates who have acquired higher education according to the regulations that were valid until the enactment of the Law, an average grade in undergraduate studies is taken, which includes thesis, if any.

When compiling the ranking list of candidates applying for enrollment in studies, the higher education institution first ranks candidates who are enrolling for the first time at that level of study and at that higher education institution, and then ranks the other candidates.

DEADLINES AND MANNER OF FILING COMPLAINS

Faculties publish lists of registered candidates, with data on points based on success achieved at the previous level of education, on the notice board and website, to which candidates can submit comments in case of technical errors within the deadline set by the faculty. After the expiry of that deadline, data that imply success at the previous levels of education are considered final.

After the entrance exam, faculties publish a preliminary ranking list for each individual study program, on the notice board and the faculty website within the deadline set by the call.

A candidate may file a complaint regarding the regularity of the procedure established by the call, the regularity of the previous aptitude test, the regularity of the entrance exam or his/her place on the ranking list within 36 hours of the publication of the preliminary ranking list at the faculty.

The appeal is submitted to the competent faculty committee, which issues a decision on the appeal within 24 hours of receiving the appeal.

The candidate has the right to file an appeal in the second-instance procedure to the dean of the faculty, within 24 hours of the expiration of the deadline for issuing a decision by the faculty committee on the candidate's appeal.

The dean of the faculty issues a final decision within 24 hours of receiving the appeal and delivers the decision to the candidate and the faculty committee.

After deciding on the appeal, the faculty determines and publishes the final ranking list of all candidates with the total number of points earned according to all criteria for **each study program** and delivers it to the University.

The University publishes the final ranking lists for each study program on the University website, after which the candidate is enrolled.

STUDENT ENROLLMENT

The candidate has exercised the right to enroll in the study programme if he / she is on the final ranking list up to the number provided by the call for admission.

ENROLLMENT OF FOREIGN STUDENTS

A foreign citizen may enroll in a study program under the same conditions as a domestic citizen.

A foreign citizen pays tuition fees throughout the entire period of study, unless otherwise specified by an international agreement.

Persons who possess a foreign higher education certificate must begin the process of recognition for the purposes of continuing education no later than **fifteen days** before the deadline set by the faculty for applying for the call.

Foreign documents submitted after these deadlines will allow for application for enrollment only in the following school year.

When applying for the call, a foreign citizen candidate shall submit a [decision on the recognition of a foreign public document](#) or a confirmation that the procedure has been initiated if the document on previous education was acquired abroad.

Before enrollment, a foreign citizen candidate is obliged to submit evidence to the faculty:

- that he/she is health insured for the school year he/she is enrolling in;
- to be fluent in the Serbian language or the language in which the study program is conducted.

ENROLLMENT OF SERBIAN CITIZENS WHO HAVE COMPLETED PREVIOUS EDUCATION ABROAD

A Serbian citizen who has completed his/her previous education abroad may apply for admission to a study program if he/she has a decision on the [recognition of a foreign higher education qualification for the purpose of continuing education at the University of Belgrade](#) and the enrollment in a specific study program. If the recognition procedure has not been completed, these candidates must submit a confirmation with their application that the procedure is ongoing.

Persons who possess a foreign higher education qualification must begin the recognition procedure for the purpose of continuing education no later than **fifteen days** before the deadline set by the faculty for the application to the call.

Foreign documents submitted after these deadlines will allow for enrollment only in the following school year.

ENROLLMENT OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

A candidate applying for admission to a study program as a candidate with a disability, when applying for admission to the desired study program, in addition to the mandatory application documentation, submits an opinion on determining the status of a candidate with a disability.

The deadline for initiating the procedure for determining the status of a candidate with a disability is **June 10, 2026**.

The procedure is initiated by submitting a [request](#) for determining the status of a candidate with a disability to the Office for Students with Disabilities, on the prescribed form.

Persons with disabilities may take [the entrance exam in a manner adapted to their capabilities](#), i.e. in a form accessible to them, and in accordance with the objective capabilities of the faculty.

In order to exercise the right to an accommodation for the entrance exam, a person with a disability is obliged to explain in writing how the entrance exam needs to be adapted and submit this explanation when applying for the call for admission to the study program.

CALL FOR ADMISSION SCHEDULE

First call for admission period

- Candidate registration: from **September 1, and no later than October 17, 2026** - according to the schedule;
- Publication of the final ranking lists of faculties/University: no later than October 26, 2026;
- Enrollment of the candidates: **no later than October 29, 2026**, after the publication of the final ranking list of the University, and according to the schedule;

After the enrollment is completed, and **no later than October 30, 2026**, the faculties submit to the University the number of enrolled students by study programs and the remaining number of vacant places.

Second call for admission period

- Candidate registration: from **October 30 to November 2, 2026** – according to the schedule;
- Publication of the final ranking lists of faculties/University: **no later than November 7, 2026**;
- Enrollment of the candidates: **no later than November 10, 2026**, after the publication of the final ranking list of the University, and according to the schedule;

After the enrollment is completed, and **no later than November 11, 2026**, the faculties submit to the University the number of enrolled students by study program and the remaining number of vacant places.

Third call for admission period

Enrollment within the third enrollment period will be carried out only for study programs for which the faculty submits a request to organize this period.

- **no later than November 19, 2026** – the University publishes the final rankings by study programs that are the basis for enrollment;
- **no later than November 23, 2026** – the faculties submit to the University the number of enrolled students by study programs and the number of vacant places.

The calendar may be changed later, in accordance with the circumstances.

Candidates submit applications to the call through the student services of the faculties where the study program is being conducted.

OTHER PROVISIONS

When applying for the call, candidates must submit original documents for inspection, and together with the application form, they must submit photocopies of the following documents:

- diplomas and diploma supplements, i.e. certificates of completion of the undergraduate academic and master academic studies;
- decision on the recognition of a foreign higher education certificate or confirmation that the recognition procedure for the purpose of continuing education has been initiated (only for candidates who have a foreign higher education certificate);
- proof of payment of the application fee;
- other evidence, if necessary.

When applying for the call, a diploma and diploma supplement, i.e. a certificate of graduation with a certificate of passing exams issued by an accredited higher education institution and study program, are submitted.

A candidate who completed his studies according to the regulations that valid before the enactment of the Law on Higher Education ("Official Gazette of the Republic of Serbia", No. 76/2005, 100/2007 - authentic interpretation, 97/2008, 44/2010, 93/2012, 89/2013, 99/2014, 45/2015 - authentic interpretation, 68/2015 and 87/2016) must submit a certificate of passed exams with his diploma, instead of a diploma supplement.

A candidate who has not been issued a diploma, upon enrollment, must submit a certificate of graduation with a certificate of passed exams, provided that, no later than within one year, he delivers the diploma and the diploma supplement to the faculty or university on the completed previous level of higher education.

A diploma of completed first level of higher education in academic studies that the candidate has acquired with the recognition of part of the first-level vocational study program is considered valid for enrollment in the second and third levels of studies only if the volume of recognized exams from the vocational study program does not exceed 30% of the total volume of the academic study program in which the diploma was acquired (72/240 ECTS credits, or 54/180 ECTS credits) in accordance with the Regulations on Standards and Procedures for Accreditation of Study Programs.

The university or faculty implementing the study program in which the candidate is enrolled is obliged to check the submitted higher education documents and if it determines that the document was not issued in accordance with applicable regulations, the candidate is not entitled to enrollment.

If it is subsequently determined that the document of completed previous level of studies has deficiencies, the enrollment cancellation procedure is carried out, in accordance with the Law.

Candidates who have a foreign higher education certificate, submit a confirmation that the recognition procedure at the University has been initiated when applying.

Also, the candidate makes a [statement authorizing the Faculty and the University](#) to inspect, obtain and process personal data for the purposes of the admission process and for the purpose of studying; that personal data may be entered into an electronic database, that they may be used for the purposes of generating the necessary statistical data, submitting the requested data to the Ministry of Education, and that they will not be accessible to unauthorized persons.

All candidates also sign a [statement](#) that they are enrolling for the first time in the degree of study they are applying to and the higher education institution they are applying to.

For the costs that the Faculty/University has in connection with the implementation of the call, candidates pay a fee to the Faculty/University's bank account, in the amount determined by the Faculty/University.

Candidates who acquire the right to enroll submit:

- certified photocopies of documents and original documents for inspection,
- birth certificate (the faculty, i.e. the University, obtains a birth certificate *ex officio*, except for foreign citizens who are obliged to submit this document),
- completed form ŠV-20 (the form can also be completed electronically, and the printed version is signed and submitted to the faculty),
- index (if the faculty does not provide indexes),
- two photographs of 4.5x3.5 cm,
- proof of payment of the fee for enrollment costs (if a fee is provided),
- proof of payment of tuition fees (or part of the tuition fees) for self-financing students,
- proof of payment of the fee for the University Center for Career Development and Student Counseling,
- other evidence if necessary.

For candidates who completed their previous level of studies abroad, it is necessary to submit a decision of the rector on the recognition of a foreign public higher education certificate when enrolling.

A candidate who has acquired the right to enroll but does not enroll within the prescribed deadline, loses the right to enroll and the next candidate will be enrolled in his place according to the established order.

NOTE:

The University of Belgrade reserves the right to amend the text of the Call for Admission as well as the General Provisions for Enrollment in Studies. All possible corrections to the Call

for Admission will be published on the website of the University of Belgrade and the relevant Faculties. All detailed information can be found on the websites of the Faculties.
