STUDY PROGRAM IN ENGLISH FOR WHICH THE CALL HAS BEEN ANNOUNCED:

Law and Gender – 60 ECTS credits

***NUMBER OF VACANCIES FOR STUDENTS:**

60 students are enrolled in the 60 ECTS credits Master's degree program in Law and Gender, 3 of which are funded by the budget and 57 are self-financing students.

**The Government of the Republic of Serbia has not adopted a Decision on the number of students for enrollment in the first year of study programs financed from the budget for higher education institutions founded by the Republic of Serbia for the 2026/2027 school year. If the number of approved budget places is less than the specified number, those places will be redistributed, and the number of self-financing places will be changed so that the total number of students enrolling in the study program remains unchanged.*

SPECIAL ENROLLMENT CONDITIONS:

The following may enroll in the Law and Gender study program, subject to the conditions and procedures prescribed for enrollment in master's academic studies at the University of Belgrade - Faculty of Law:

- 1) candidates who have obtained a four-year undergraduate academic degree in the field of law or other social and humanistic sciences and have achieved 240 ECTS credits, or persons who have completed four-year undergraduate studies under the law that was valid before the enactment of the Law on Higher Education;
- 2) candidates who have completed integrated studies, or master academic studies, having achieved at least 300 ECTS credits.

The prerequisite for enrollment is proof of English language proficiency at the upper intermediate level of competence = B2 – *Cambridge Advanced Certificate in English (CAE)* or *IELTS (International English Language Testing System)* certificate or completed secondary school education in English.

More detailed enrollment requirements can be found on the notice board and the Faculty website.

CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING THE ORDER OF CANDIDATES ON THE RANKING LIST:

The order of applicants for enrollment is determined on the basis of the overall average grade, the length of study and the corpus of subjects of importance for studies in the applied module.

Candidates can score 120 points, based on the overall average grade, length of study and the corpus of subjects relevant to studies in the applied module. The overall average grade refers to the average grade from the previous level of study multiplied by 10. On this basis, candidates can score a maximum of 100 points in total. Based on the length of study, candidates can score a maximum of 10 points. Based on the corpus of subjects of importance for studies in the registered module, candidates can score a maximum of 10 points. The corpus of subjects of importance for studies in the applied module consists of subjects of the previously completed study programme, the assessment of which is performed by the competent professional body of the Faculty.

The overall average grade will be multiplied by 10.

The length of study will be scored as follows:

The length of study for candidates who have completed integrated academic studies and candidates who have scored 300 ECTS credits in academic studies (180 US + 120 MAS) will be scored as follows:

Corpus of subjects of importance for studies in the applied module:

These are the subjects of the previously completed study programme, the assessment of which is performed by the competent professional body of the Faculty, and which are important for studies in the applied module:

- if the studies were completed at the Faculty of Law whose founder is the Republic of Serbia or the Republic of Srpska: 10 points;
- if the studies have been completed at another law or related faculty of social and human sciences (with the potential obligation to take additional exams): 2 points.

Additional exams for candidates who have graduated from another law or related Faculty of social and human sciences are determined by the Decision of the Teaching-scientific Council on enrollment in master academic studies of candidates who have not completed the Faculty of Law of the University of Belgrade and the decision of the Teaching-scientific Council on specifying the conditions for enrollment in the master academic studies.

TUITION FEE:

Tuition fee for the citizens of the Republic of Serbia: 160.000,00 dinars.

Tuition fee for foreign citizens: 2.400,00 EUR.
